

Coalition, campaign unite Manatee County leaders

Community leaders representing a wide cross-section of agencies and organizations serving Manatee County came together Aug. 5 to launch a united effort in the fight against COVID-19.

Mask Up Manatee! is the name of the coalition and campaign that targets Manatee residents and visitors with messaging and activities that encourage each and every one of us to take steps to prevent the spread of this deadly virus throughout the community.

Schools Superintendent Cynthia Saunders, Health Officer Dr. Jennifer Bencie and Administrator Cheri Coryea identified the need for a unified campaign during a virtual meeting in mid-July.

Since then, staff have developed campaign materials bearing the Mask Up Manatee! brand.

Coalition partners are already sharing messaging via social media and broadcast outlets, including Facebook, Twitter and Manatee Schools TV.

Messaging promotes, among other things, the importance of wearing face coverings in public, social distancing, washing hands properly and frequently and wiping down high-touch surfaces.
